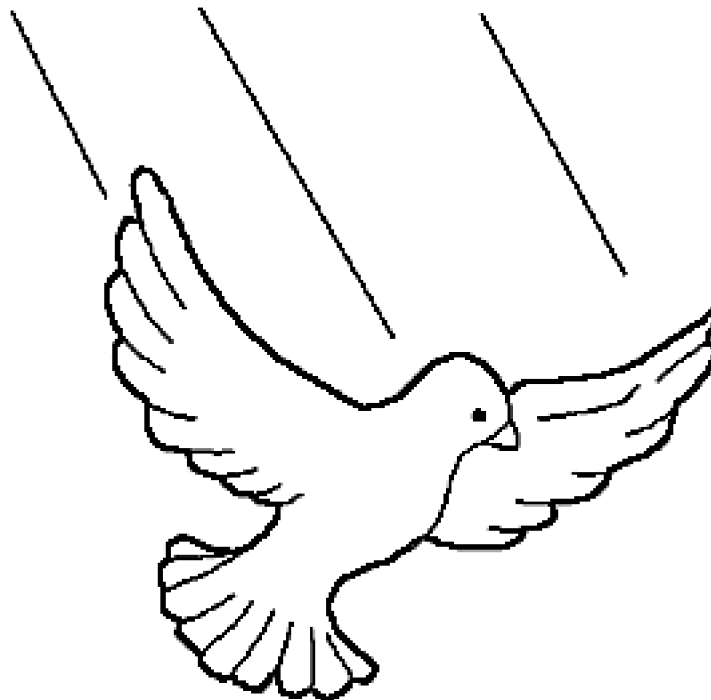

Program Notes

A contemporary rearrangement of the classic Picardy tune as a set of variations. The organ plays an ethereal repeated descending melodic figure (suggestive of "Christ, our God to earth descendeth") as the basic melody ascends (people yearning, reaching upward). The choir section and brass interlude of harmonic and contrapuntal richness give this meditative piece a contemporary freshness and transparency. First performance by St. Barnabas Episcopal Church Choir of Denver, Colorado December 1996. The work was also a feature at the Christian Fellowship of Art Music Composers annual conference in 2008 at Indiana Wesleyan University, Marian, IN.
